This project forms an ideal combination of Brazilian rhythmic diversity with European brass tradition. Fernando Paiva's stirring melodies are created by the soulful voice of Verena Loipetsberger, the sound of the big band and the soloists of the UAJO. The multi-layered arrangements are able to empathize with Paiva's musical world, which is influenced by Afro-Brazilian motifs as well as many other styles. This universal music, as I understand it, is enriched here by the compositions of Christian Maurer, Andreas See, Primus Sitter, Anna Maurer and Manfred Paul Weinberger. They also testify to the fact that music does more than just unite our cultures.

The BWM Project is a co-production of the UAJO with composer, drummer and percussionist Fernando Paiva from Porto Alegre (Brazil).

Inspired by his homeland, Paiva draws from the sources of Brazilian music, jazz, African but also classical music in his diverse compositions. The musicians of UAJO act as experienced arrangers and transform the sound of this special sound world into an orchestral experience. Compositions by the band members complement the program and also focus on musical styles from South America, Africa and India. Jazz singer Verena Loipetsberger, also from Upper Austria, brings her personal experiences and love of music from around the world to this melange of musical influences.

After 27 years of continuous creative work, after 12 CD productions - which on the one hand offer own projects, on the other hand cooperations with guests like Kenny Wheeler, Jack Walrath, Mike Gibbs, Tini Kainrath and concerts with international jazz greats like Toshiko Akyioshi, Maria João, Mike Stern, Richard Bona, Mike Mainieri, Richard Galliano, Jane Monheit and Ed Puddick - the UAJO opens with the new program an exciting chapter, in the development of its big band sound.
